BIG BIRD HISTORY

CEN-TEX Modelers Inc. has held an annual BIG BIRD event every year since 1987. This event has drawn contestants from many surrounding states, Colorado, Oklahoma, Louisiana and from the four corners of the state of Texas. The events has been held during different months of the year, but has been primarily held during the April May time frame or the September October time frame. Swap meets have been held in conjunction with the event in an attempt to draw additional attendance.

Following this introduction to the history of the BIG BIRD, you will find photos that have been taken and selected to reflect each event and that reflect members and contestants alike that attended these events. The selection of these photos was based on the availability from within the current membership and news articles that have been published in the local newspaper, the Killeen Daily Herald. Fourth annual Central Texas

model aircraft fly-in June 16-17

Cen-Tex Modelers and American State Bank will sponsor the fourth annual Central Texas "Big Bird" Model Aircraft Fly-In at Stillhouse Hollow ReserviorWest of Salado the week-

end of June 16-17.

Classic World War I Sopwith Camels filling the sky with the sound of their powerful engines. World War II F4U Corsairs making strafing runs just above the runway at nearly 100 miles per hour will fill the skies over as The Fly-In. It is one of the largest such events held in Texas each year. Over fifty expertly constructed model aircraft from across the southwestern United States will fill the skies over Union Grove Park Saturday and Sunday, June 16th and 17th. To qualify for the event, each radio controlled aircraft must be classified as a "big bird", meeting minimum wingspan requirements of 80" or being an exact one-quarter scale replica of its full-scale counterpart. For the most part, they are powered by high-tech, engines running on either alcohol or gasoline which develop a great deal of horsepower for their According to Dan Smith.Georgetown the event's director, these scale models, which typically have a wingspan of from seven to ten feet or more. can take months or even years for an experienced modeler to construct, and sometimes feature detail that will include fully authentic cockpit instrumentation and controls.

Each aircraft present for the Fly-In will be built to exacting standards and will demonstrate its flying characteristics by completing a series of flight maneuvers in the air, guided by the pilot using a radio transmitter for control. "The event is one we look forward to each year,"

Smith commented, "and our participants will be here ready to show off their aircraft to the other modelers and the many spectators that are always present to view the show. It's a great spectator event." Each day at 1:00 the flyers will be shut down for 30 minutes to allow spectators to closely examine the aircraft and talk to the pilot/build-

Flying both Saturday and Sunday will begin about 8:00 a.m., and the public is encouraged to attend. The site of the Fly-In is Hall Field, the model aircraft flying site administered by Cen-Tex Modelers, in Union Grove Park on the South side of Stillhouse Hollow Reservoir. Admission is free, and refreshments and food will be available.




